


## Overview of Dublin

- Ireland's capital city is a charming blend of historical attractions and modern amenities, nestled between mountains and sea.
- Dublin is a historical and contemporary centre for education, the arts, administration and industry. As of 2018 the city was listed by the Globalization and World Cities Research Network (GaWC) as a global city, with a ranking of "Alpha -", which places it amongst the top thirty cities in the world.
- A world class destination for meetings, incentives, conferences and events (MICE), Dublin is ready for business.
- The language spoken in Dublin is English. Street signs and official buildings are signposted in both English and Gaelic, the indigenous Irish language. Despite this, you are highly unlikely to hear any Gaelic spoken on your travels across town.
- Best time to visit:- April, May & October
- The currency in use in Ireland is the Euro.

#### **The Cliffs of Moher**

- Vertigo-inducing and awe-inspiring spring to mind and they are indeed both of these things as well as being utterly wild and ruggedly beautiful.
- This is Ireland's most visited natural attraction and with good reason.
- About one and a half hours by car from Galway, in neighbouring County Clare, the cliffs are visited by close to a million people from across the globe each year.
- They stretch for eight kilometres along the Atlantic and rise some 214 meters at their highest point.







### **Killarney National Park and Muckross House & Gardens**

- 19th-century Muckross House and Gardens, set in spectacular **Killarney National Park**, should be top of the must-see list.
- Standing close to the shores of Muckross Lake, one of Killarney's three lakes that are famed worldwide for their splendour and beauty, this former mansion oozes the grandeur and gentility of bygone days.
- The house and gardens are a real treat and there are **Jaunting Cars** (Killarney's famous horse & traps) to take you around the grounds in style.
- The Killarney National Park & Lakes region is filled with beautiful scenery, and any route through it will reveal view after view of its lakes and mountains.








### The Book of Kells and Trinity College, Dublin

- Ireland's oldest university, Trinity College in Dublin is one of the country's ancient treasures.
- Founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I, Trinity is a world within a world, once you enter the gates and cross the cobblestones, it's as if the modern, thriving city outside simply melts away.
- The college is famed for its priceless treasures including the awe-inspiring **Book of Kells** (on permanent exhibition) and the mind-boggling **Long Room** (the inspiration for the library in the first Harry Potter movie).

A stroll in and around the grounds is a journey through the ages and into the hushed world of scholarly

pursuit.





#### **Guinness Storehouse**

- To many Dublin is the heart and soul of Ireland, and Guinness is at the heart of the city itself.
- Located at the heart of St. James's Gate Brewery, the seven floors are designed around a central glass atrium mirroring the shape of a pint of Guinness.
- Floor by floor, visitors take a surprising journey through the past, present and future of the world's greatest beer.
- They discover the ingredients, the process, the time, the craft and the passion that goes into every pint.

The Brewery Bar is set in stylish surroundings with magnificent views of Dublin and the Storehouse

building itself.







### **Boyne Valley**

- The Boyne Valley is the birthplace of Ireland's Ancient East and has some of the world's most mythical landscapes.
- The rich **valley** is home to a range of heritage sites including the UNESCO World Heritage Site at Brú na Bóinne (Newgrange and Knowth) as well as Ireland's largest Anglo-Norman castle at Trim.
- Deep in the Royal County, Trim Castle is an example of what a castle should look like. Mel Gibson and the
  makers of the film "Braveheart" certainly thought so because they chose it as the location for some of the
  gorier scenes of that film.







### **Glendalough and Wicklow**

- Magical and mysterious, Glendalough is home to one of the most important monastic sites in Ireland.
- Known as the Garden of Ireland, County Wicklow is one of Ireland's true scenic treasures with its magnificent hills and mountains, long sandy beaches, rivers and lakes.
- Glendalough, a glacial valley renowned for its early medieval monastic settlement founded in the 6th Century by St Kevin, a hermit priest, and partly destroyed in 1398 by English troops.
- The monastic site with its incredibly preserved round tower is a joy to explore, and the surrounding woodlands and lakes are perfect for rambling through at your leisure or stopping off for a picnic.







#### **Kilmainham Gaol Museum**

- Kilmainham Gaol is a former prison, now operating as a museum. It opened in 1796 as the new County Gaol for Dublin and closed its doors in 1924.
- Today the building symbolises the tradition of militant and constitutional nationalism from the rebellion of 1798 to the Irish Civil War of 1922-23.
- Many Irish revolutionaries, including the leaders of the 1916 Easter Rising, were imprisoned and executed
  in the prison by the British.







#### Sea Safari in Dublin

- Sea Safari will bring you on an exciting, fun filled sea tour of the Dublin Bay area while also showing you spectacular sights and attractions.
- The trip leaves Dun Laoghaire Harbour, turning right heading south along the east coast, passing Sandy cove and the James Joyce Martello tower, then continuing on passed Bulloch Harbour, into Dalkey Sound passing the Island and entering Killiney Bay which is over looked by a number of celebrity homes such as Bono and Enya. At this stage group would turn around and head back towards Dun Laoghaire.







#### **Malahide Castle**

- Malahide Castle, parts of which date to the 12th century, lies, with over 260 acres of remaining estate parkland, close to the village of Malahide, nine miles north of central Dublin in Ireland.
- The tour includes a guided tour of Malahide Castle, one of the most stunning and perfectly preserved medieval castles in Ireland. Dating from the 12th century, you'll learn about the adventures of the Talbot family who lived there for generations. Visit the extensive castle grounds and Avoca Café and clothing shop located adjacent to the castle.

## Visa - Requirement & Procedure for Tourist

- Passport: Original Passport with validity of minimum sixing his and minimum two blank pages for visa stamp.
  - a) Copy of previous passports and visa issued
  - b) Copy of all pages of current passport
  - c) Attach all your old passports (if any)
  - d) If refused any visa, details of original letter issued by the authorities of that country would be preferred
- Ireland Visa Application Form: Visa application form must be filled online through <a href="https://www.visas.inis.gov.ie/avats/OnlineHome.aspx">https://www.visas.inis.gov.ie/avats/OnlineHome.aspx</a>
   Please Note: Form should be printed and signed by the applicant.
- Photo Specification: Two recent passport size photographs with matt or semi matt finish, 60%-80% face coverage, white background and without border (Size: 35mm x 45mm)
   Please note: Photograph should not be more than 3 months old, scanned/stapled and should not be used in any of the previous visas
- Covering-Letter: <u>Covering Letter</u> from applicant on business letter head mentioning name, designation, passport number, purpose and duration of visit in brief. The letter should be duly signed by authorized signatory with company stamp and addressed to The Visa Officer, Embassy of Ireland, New Delhi.
   Please Note: <u>Covering Letter</u> on Letterhead if applicant is Self Employed or on plain paper if Employed.

If applying from Mumbai - It should be addressed to "Consulate General of Ireland, Mumbai"



### Visa - Requirement & Procedure for Tourist Visa

- Sponsor
  - a) Relationship Proof from reference in Ireland.
  - b) If your reference is not an Irish/EEA citizen, evidence of their permission to remain in Ireland a copy of their GNIB card and copy of their passport showing Immigration stamps.
  - c) If your reference in Ireland is supporting you, they must supply a detailed 6 month bank statement for the period immediately prior to your visa application showing sufficient funds to support you for the duration of your stay.
  - d) A written undertaking your reference that you will observe the conditions of your visa, that you will not become a burden on the Irish State and that you will leave the State on the expiration of your visa.
- Financials
  - a) Personal ITR for 3 yrs.
  - b) Personal Bank Statement for last six months mentioning the Bank's name, Bank's Telephone Number clearly
  - c) Last three months salary slips
- Proof of Occupation
  - Self Employed
  - a) Company Registration Certificate / Certificate of Incorporation
  - b) Brief Company Profile
  - c) Articles of Memorandum (Incase the applicant is MD/Director)
  - d) Proof of Proprietorship / Partnership (In case applicant is Proprietor / Partner in a firm)
  - e) Import / Export License (if applicable)



# Visa - Requirement & Procedure for Tourist

- Employed **Visa** 
  - a) Letter from your employee stating how long he/she is employed with the company. The dates that you would be on annual leave and return back to work.

Student

a) Letter from your college stating what course he/she is pursuing, how many years you have been a student in that college. The dates that you would be on leave and return back to college.

Housewife /Children under 18 yrs.:

- a) You must submit marriage certificate and birth certificate for the children
- b) Details of family members and proof of accommodation residing in India
- Proof of Accommodation : Hotel confirmation or letter from reference in Ireland undertaking to provide you the accommodation and Tour Itinerary
- Airline Reservation : Ticket Itinerary
- Medical: Overseas Medical Insurance as per travel date is mandatory.
- For Group tours Itinerary and Booking Receipt are also required.
- If visiting another EU member state prior to traveling to Ireland, the relevant visa for that country should be obtained before a visa for Ireland can be Issued.



### Visa - Requirement & Procedure for Tourist Visa

- If traveling to visit a non EU national resident in the state, details of non EU national's permission to remain in this state should be submitted (e.g. Garda (Police) Registration Card).
- Visa Fees: Visa fees & VFS service charge has to be paid online and the payment receipt has to be submitted along with the visa application.
- Please Note:
  - a) Biometrics is mandatory for Ireland Visa. Please click the following link to know about <u>Biometric</u> Exemptions.
  - b) Applicant need to personally visit Ireland visa application centre on the appointment date to submit the visa application even if there is no biometrics required.
  - c) Appointment confirmation receipt should be carried for Biometrics/Submission.
  - d) Applicant can either collect the passport personally from VFS or can opt for courier service and mention Udaan's office address while filling up the online form so that quality check of Visa can be done post stamping to ensure that correct information is captured by the Embassy.
- British Irish Visa Scheme: Indian citizens can now apply for one travel permit to visit both the UK and Ireland through British-Irish Visa Scheme (BIVS) in India. As per BIVS, applicants should apply for the visa of the country they wish to visit first. If you have an Irish short stay visa and you also want to visit the United Kingdom you must travel to Ireland first. If you have a British short stay visa and you also want to visit Ireland you must travel to the United Kingdom first. The BIVS issued visas will have BIVS coding endorsed on it.
