

Overview

- Turkey is a nation straddling eastern Europe and western Asia with cultural connections to ancient Greek, Persian, Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman empires.
- Turkey is bordered by Greece and Bulgaria to its northwest; Georgia to its northeast; Armenia, the Azerbaijani exclave of Nakhchivan and Iran to the east; and Iraq and Syria to the south.
- Approximately 70 to 80 per cent of the country's citizens identify as Turkish.
- The most common ethnic languages spoken in Turkey is Turkish and English is spoken at few people.
- Ankara is the capital.
- Istanbul is the largest European City and 4th largest city in the world.

Cuisine







- Turkish cuisine is largely the heritage of Ottoman cuisine, which are a fusion of Central Asian, Middle Eastern, Eastern European and Balkan cuisines.
- Turkish Cuisine varies from across the country.
- The cooking of Istanbul, Bursa, Izmir, and the Asia Minor region are less spicy, prefer rice with vegetable stew.
- The Black Sea region uses Fish extensively in their main dishes.
- Western region use olive oil in their cooking.
- Southern region include kebabs, mezes and dough-based desserts.
- Women's attire consists of baggy trousers (Turkish şalvar), a long skirt, robe or dress, a shirt, a jacket, a wide belt, or piece of cloth worn as a belt, a scarf or other headdress, socks and shoes.
- Men in Turkey also wear Turkish şalvar and may add a traditional loose coat, called a jubba over the şalvar.



Best Time to Visit

- One can visit Turkey throughout the year depending upon there interest.
- April, May, September and October are pleasantly warm thereby Best Time to Visit
- June, July and August being the Summer Months are very Hot with Temperature going up to mid 30°C on the south coast




Istanbul Archaeology Museum



- Istanbul Archaeology Museum is 500 meters away from Topkapi Palace.
- This important museum complex brings together a staggering array of artifacts from Turkey and throughout the Middle East, which sweeps through the vast breadth of history of this region.
- There are three separate sections in the complex, each of which are worthy of a visit: the Museum of the Ancient Orient; the main Archaeology Museum; and the Tiled Pavilion of Mehmet the Conqueror.

Süleymaniye Mosque



- Sitting high on the hill above Sultanahmet district, the Süleymaniye Mosque is one of the most recognized landmarks of Istanbul.
- It was built for Süleyman the Magnificent by the famed Ottoman architect Sinan between 1549 and 1575.
- The interior, dominated by its soaring 53-meter-high dome. Outside in the tranquil garden area is an interesting **Ottoman cemetery** that is also home to the tombs of the Sultan Süleyman and his wife Haseki Hürrem Sultan.



Aya Sofya



- Aya Sofya or formally known as Hagia Sophia was the former Greek Orthodox Christian patriarchal cathedral, later an Ottoman imperial mosque and now a museum.
- The Aya Sofya was the emperor's swaggering statement to the world of the wealth and technical ability of his empire.
- The construction consists of mostly masonry ie. Combinatoin of Bricks and mortar joints..
- The mortar joints are composed of a combination of sand and minute ceramic pieces displaced very evenly throughout the mortar joints.

The Topkapi Palace



- The Topkapi Palace is a large museum in Istanbul.
- The Topkapı Palace Museum is administered by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism.
- The palace complex has hundreds of rooms and chambers, but only the important are accessible to the public today, including the Ottoman Imperial Harem and the treasury in display.
- Topkapı Palace is part the Historic Areas of Istanbul, a group of sites in Istanbul that were added to the UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985.



The Blue Mosque



- A historic mosque located in Istanbul is a opular tourist site and a functional mosque.
- The Blue Mosque, as it is popularly known, was constructed between 1609 and 1616 during the rule of Ahmed I.
- Its Külliye contains Ahmed's tomb, a madrasah and a hospice.
- Hand-painted blue tiles adorn the mosque's interior walls, and at night the mosque is bathed in blue as lights frame the mosque's five main domes, six minarets and eight secondary domes.

Basilica Cistern



- The Basilica Cisternis the largest of several hundred ancient cisterns that lie beneath the city of Istanbul.
- The cistern, located 150 metres (490 ft) southwest of the Hagia Sophia on the historical peninsula of Sarayburnu, was built in the 6th century during the reign of Byzantine Emperor Justinian I.
- Today it is kept with little water, for public access inside the space.



Dolmabahçe Palace



- The sumptuous and ornate Dolmabahçe Palace shows the clear influence of European decoration and architecture on the Ottoman Empire in the 19th century.
- Built by Sultan Abdülmecid I in 1854, it replaced Topkapi
 Palace as the main residence of the sultans
- The interiors mix Rococo, Baroque, Neoclassical, and Ottoman elements, with mammoth crystal chandeliers, liberal use of gold, French-style furniture, and dazzling frescoed ceilings.

Chora Church



- The Church of the Holy Saviour in Chora is a medieval Byzantine Greek Orthodox church preserved as the Chora Museum in the Edirnekapı neighborhood of Istanbul.
- In the 16th century, during the Ottoman era, the church was converted into a mosque; it became a museum in 1948.
- The interior of the building is covered with some of the oldest and finest surviving Byzantine mosaics and frescoes; they were uncovered and restored after the building was secularized and turned into a museum.



Taksim Square



- Fanning out from Taksim Square with its Republic Monument,
 Taksim is a busy nightlife, shopping, and dining area.
- Vintage trams shuttle along Istiklal Caddesi, the city's main pedestrian boulevard, which is lined with 19th-century buildings housing international shopping chains, movie theaters, and cafes.
- The dense network of side streets is filled with bars, antiques shops, and rooftop eateries with Bosphorus views.

Yedikule Fortress



- Yedikule Fortress (meaning Fortress of the Seven Towers) is a fortified historic structure located in the Yedikule neighbourhood of Fatih.
- Built in 1458 on the commission of Ottoman Sultan Mehmed II, the seven-tower complex was created by adding three new towers and fully enclosing a section of the ancient Walls of Constantinople, including the two twin towers that originally constituted the triumphal Golden Gate.
- An open-air theater has been built in more recent years, and is used for cultural festivals.



Galata Tower



- The Galata Tower by the Genoese is a medieval stone tower. It was the city's tallest structure when it was built.
- It is a high, cone-capped cylinder that dominates the skyline and offers a panoramic vista of Istanbul's historic peninsula
- The nine-story tower is 219.5 ft and 169.5 ft the observation deck is located and has two operating elevators for visitors.
- There is a restaurant, cafe and a nightclub which hosts a Turkish show on its upper floors offering the skylines of Turkey.

Pera Museum



- Istanbul's most famous art gallery is the lovely Pera Museum, which is where art-hounds head to drink in one of the finest collections of Ottoman-era painting in the world.
- Pera Museum hosts regular, international loan exhibitions, in addition to holding permanent collections of Orientalist Paintings, Anatolian Weights and Measures, and Kütahya Tiles and Ceramics.







Bosphorus Cruise

- A cruise on the Bosphorus is probably the most overlooked Istanbul tourist attraction.
- Enjoy traditional musical and dance performances from different regions of Turkey and of course, a belly dancer!

Whirling Dervish Ceremony

- Marvel at the mystique of whirling dervishes as they gracefully dance the ceremonial 'sema' Mevlevi at the emblematic Hodjapasha Dance Theater in Istanbul.
- It is the UNESCO-listed ceremonial dance.
- Enjoy a cultural evening in Istanbul during this age-old performance of choreographed spiritual dancing accompanied by traditional music and Persian chanting for about 1.5 hours.
- Be captivated as the semazens dance and chant their way around the stage and listen to traditional Persian and Turkish music from a live orchestra.









Turkish Bath

- Turkish Bath is a place of public bathing associated with the culture of the Ottoman Empire and more widely the Islamic world.
- It starts with relaxation in a room heated by a continuous flow of hot, dry air, allowing the bather to perspire freely.
- Bathers may then move to an even hotter room before they wash in cold water.
- After performing a full body wash and receiving a massage, bathers finally retire to the cooling-room for a period of relaxation.









The Princes' Island Tour

- The Princes' Islands are a cluster of 9 islands southeast of Istanbul in the Sea of Marmara.
- This islands are mainly car-free and are known for their horse-drawn carriages (phaetons).
- During the summer months, the Princes' Islands are popular destinations for day trips from Istanbul.
- They are just a short ferry ride from Istanbul, with ferries departing from Bostancı, Kartal and Maltepe on the Asian side, and from Kabataş on the European side.
- Most ferries call in turn at the four largest of the nine islands: Kınalıada, Burgazada, Heybeliada and, finally, Büyükada.
- In spring and autumn, the islands are quieter and more pleasant, although the sea can be rough in spring, autumn.
- During winter, with the addition of the biting cold and the strong winds and storm, resulting ferry cancellations, the islands become almost deserted.







Explore Local Market

- The most-visited tourist attraction in the whole city, the Grand Bazaar is a place you simply must experience during a stay in Istanbul.
- A never-ending hive of activity, you'll find this marketplace overflowing with insistent locals selling everything from exquisite hand-embodied rugs to intricate silver jewelry to dazzling lanterns in every color of the rainbow.
- Shop owners seem to beckon from every direction, luring many in with cups of warm apple tea and samples of their delicious Turkish delight.



Göreme Open-Air Museum



- The Goreme Open-Air Museum resembles a vast monastic complex composed of scores of refectory monasteries placed side-by-side, each with its own fantastic church.
- It contains the finest of the rock-cut churches, with beautiful frescoes (wall paintings) whose colors still retain all their original freshness.
- The Goreme Open Air Museum has been a member of UNESCO World Heritage List since 1984, and was one of the first two UNESCO sites in Turkey.


Zelve Open-Air Museum



- The Zelve Open-Air Museum, which once housed one of the largest communities in the region is an amazing cave town, honeycombed with dwellings, religious and secular chambers.
- In this incredible cave town, you can walk amongst historic dwellings, churches, and religious chambers as well as the town square.



Underground Cities





- Cappadocia's underground cities first began to be chiseled out of the ground in the Bronze Age Hittite era, but they are most famous for their early Byzantine history (6th and 7th centuries), when the region's Christians took to living underground for long periods to escape from Arab and Persian invaders.
- With a labyrinth of rooms connected by tunnels that extends for eight levels. Four of these levels can be explored by visitors.
- Derinkuyu Underground City is Cappadocia's deepest underground shelter, and just like Kaymakli, was used by the early Christians to hide from attack. The tunnels here are quite claustrophobic in places as they travel deeper and deeper into the ground.
- Derinkuyu and Kaymakli Underground Cities are close enough together to see both on a day trip, but if you only want to see one, Derinkuyu is less popular with large tourist coach loads, so you're more likely to be able to explore the tunnels here unhindered by crowds.




Red and Rose Valleys



- Cappadocia's most beautiful intertwining valleys lie between the villages of Göreme and Çavusin.
- The rolling and rippling rock faces arc out across the countryside in a palette of pastel pink, yellow, and orange cliffs, formed by volcanic explosion and millennia of wind and water erosion.
- Three particular attractions within Rose Valley are the Kolonlu Kilise (Columned Church); Haçli Kilise (Church of the Cross), with its mammoth cross carved into the cave ceiling; and the Uç Haçli Kilise (Church of the Three Crosses).

Eski Gümüsler Monastery



- Eski Gumusler rock church has some very impressive frescoes that rival those of the more famous churches near Göreme.
- The paintings date from the 11th century and include the Annunciation and the Virgin Mary with baby Jesus flanked by the Archangels Gabriel and Michael.
- Just as interesting as the frescoes is the mazy series of tunnels you can explore within the complex that have been recently restored and opened up for tourism.

- Cappadocia is known around the world as one of the best places to fly with hot air balloons.
- The spectacular surrealistic landscapes combined with excellent flying conditions allow the balloons to gently drift over and between fairy chimneys, pigeon houses hewn into the unique rock formations, orchards and vineyards.
